North Gate Barrier Arm - Update: The barrier arm has now been operational for two weeks. To speed traffic through the entrance during daytime hours, the barrier gate will be used from 6 AM to 6 PM, and the swing gate will be used from 6 PM to 6 AM. Those using this entrance are asked to exercise patience and not push into the gate arm. Such an action results in the motor going into failsafe mode, rendering the gate inoperable until it can be reset. The gate arm moves very quickly in comparison to the swing gate, but Security and Safety will continue to monitor the timing of the gate arm as well. For your own safety, please do not walk or stand near the barrier gate.

REED SMITH

Reed relocated to Sanford three years ago with his wife, of 26 years, Micki. They currently reside in Carolina Trace and are very active members of the country club and their respective POA. Reed has experience as a POA President and other board positions for 10 years when he lived in the state of Washington. He has also served on numerous volunteer board positions, over the years, as he enjoys serving and doing his part to better the community. Reed makes his living working for a large tech company where he sells internet security products to large businesses. His career has spanned over 23 years, and he is looking forward to retirement perhaps in another 5-10 years. His plans are to keep busy with his hobbies which include golfing, woodworking, and continuing volunteer work within the community.



LUIS GARCIA JR

Luis was born in Marianao, Cuba and moved to Florida in 1960. He became a paramedic in 1977, earned an Associate of Science degree from Miami-Dade Community College and in Emergency Medical Services Management in 1990. In 1997 he completed training as an Executive Fire Officer at the National Fire Academy in Emmitsburg, Maryland. In 1996 Luis was named as the city's first Cuban American Fire Chief. Under his watch, fire related deaths were reduced to zero in two years. After retiring as Miami Beach Fire Chief in 1999, he successfully ran for the Miami Beach City Commission and continued to serve in that capacity for seven years. In November 2006 Luis was elected to the Florida House of Representatives in district 107 and reelected in 2008 and 2010. In 2009 he was honored by the Florida Nurses Association as their "Legislator of the Year.



JOHN C. THORN

Born and raised in Poughkeepsie, New York. He retired from the US Army after serving 20 years as a Chaplain Assistant/Chaplain Activities Supervisor/Chaplain Administrator. His overseas assignments included Japan and Republic of Korea. Ten years of his Army career were spent at the United States Military Academy, West Point (1975-1986). While at West Point, he created computer programs using the "new" PC architecture to facilitate management of Chaplain Funds. These programs drew the attention of the Pentagon and were eventually distributed worldwide to all Chaplain Offices. His last duty assignment was as Chief Instructor for Leadership and Management, US Army Chaplain Center, and School. Upon retirement from the Army, he was hired as a programmer for Ticketron, a subsidiary of Control Data Corporation, where he was responsible for promoter accounting software used throughout venues handled by that company. Notables include Shubert Theater Group, The Ford Theater, The Mets, The US Open, Saratoga Center for the Performing Arts, and others. In 1990 he was hired by BMW of North America and served in many Information Management positions. He was responsible for all computer networks in BMW's North American Dealerships. He served as a member of the NADA STAR committee and was responsible for creating standards used throughout the automotive industry. BMW was the first automotive brand to have 100% of its dealer franchises using the Internet for all electronic communications. In 2001 he was promoted to become BMW's Training Technologies Manager, responsible for all technologies used in training internal and dealer personnel. This included management of a VSAT television network, two television studios, as well as establishing a comprehensive Internet-based learning management system for over 40,000 students. In conjunction with BMW AG, he created BMW's worldwide standards for creating and distributing Internet video. In the 1990's John designed and programmed an Internet Website for his church which received the attention of and award from US Today. He also designed and programmed Internet based applications for the Salvation Army. He created the original North Shore and NC State Questers' websites. John and his wife, Susan, reside at 287 Fairway Lane. John has served many years on the North Shore Board of

Directors and North Shore Architecture Committee. He is currently serving as the Vice President of the Fire Board
